

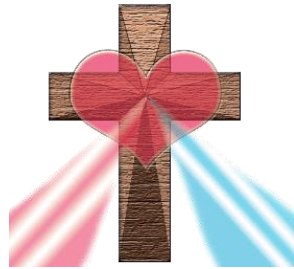

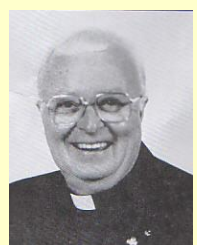
**Mrs. Gretchen Robens**

He is presently assigned to St. James Church in Danielson, Connecticut and conducts healing services throughout the world. He is the director of the St. Raphael Holy Healing Oil Ministry based in Vermont.

Raised in the Philippines, Sr. Teresa left her native country after experiencing a calling during a Divine Mercy mission organized by the Boston OLM community. She is now active in the Congregation's apostolic mission of bringing the mercy of God closer to people through prayer.
